2010 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

Project Schedule

Please note: Due to the weather, the previous schedule has been revised.

Completed Work:	Sanitary sewer, water main and storm sewer have been installed.
Current Work:	Service installation on 7th Street (north of 2nd Avenue) and on 2nd and 3rd Avenue. Sub-cutting on 7th Street (South of 2nd Avenue)
Late July / Early August:	Curb and gutter installation on 1st Avenue and 7th Street (south of 2nd Avenue) Sub-Cutting roadways north of 2nd Avenue
Early August:	Removal of bituminous and temporary water main on 7th Street (between Church Avenue and Shamrock Lane)

Water Services

The City is replacing water service lines from the main line in the street to the right of way. The Contractor is back flushing your service line prior to connecting to the new service line. Back flushing is a process that dislodges the foreign matter in your service line between the house and right of way. It may take a few days for this matter to be cleaned out of your system. New hydrants have been placed throughout the development to help the City flush the water main more effectively in the future. This new system should help the City provide you with a good clean potable water in the future.

Due to the construction around your property, it may be a good time to consider replacing your service line from the right of way to your house. If interested, you may contact a local utility contractor or Tim Brawthen who will put you in contact with the City's Contractor.

Concrete is Coming!

Preparations have started in anticipation of pouring concrete curb and gutter during the last week of July or first week in August for the residential area south of 2nd Avenue. If all goes well, concrete driveway aprons will be poured soon after. In an effort to expedite these construction items, we ask that you do not park your vehicle in the construction area between the hours of 7 AM and 7 PM once the concrete construction starts. The roadway will be available for parking before and after these hours and on weekends. You will not have access to your driveway for a few days once the curb is poured. You will be notified by the contractor prior to placing the curb to make sure you will have access to your vehicle. Please do not drive on any new concrete for a period of seven days after it has been poured; this includes curb, gutter, driveway aprons and driveways. Excessive weight on the concrete could cause it to crack; any cracked areas need to be replaced.
